

## Minutes of the Greater Jacksonville Association, by zoom

### Wednesday, September 1<sup>st</sup> at 7.30pm

President, Dave Perrott opened the meeting. Also present, David Palmer, Mitch Daly, Marc Peters, Helen Petrich

The previous minutes were approved, with no changes.

The Treasury report was approved, with a balance of \$14,455.36.

This is a high limit, some people have double paid, subscription will be extended

David Palmer met with Adam Rosenblatt and got samples of bricks for the "Log Cabin " property and will send them to the Starbucks architect.

Trying to match with the shopping center bricks would not be feasible as they are an old style. A substantial iron fence has been erected between the site and the shopping center.

The request for the site permit will go to a public hearing and if satisfied the restrictive covenants for only one building will apply. Rosenblatt will inform us of the hearing. The barbecue building will be demolished. The property title has not yet been transferred, may take a year.

#### New Business.

Johnny O met with Dave Perrott and David Palmer, they enjoyed a meal at Brookside. Johnny was given the background to the proposed Starbucks site.

Dulaney High School should be completely newly built. Chris West is in favor of spending the funds.

It is hoped that September 21<sup>st</sup> will be an in-house and zoom meeting in Fairview Hall. This could change according to the reduced number of people permitted in a Baltimore County building. Joe Garrett; husband of Pastor Anne; will be contacted for specifics of how to zoom from the hall.

The subject will be the update on the Exxon spill of many years ago. Wifi, a screen and slides will be needed for this.

A possible mailing will be sent to the present association members (130) and 300 non-paid. This will be clarified. Stamp fee will be \$140.00

Helen announced that the Baltimore County Department of Aging; during Covid, worked on a feasibility study to provide a separate, new Senior Center of 14,000 sf. Estimated time is

three years, the members will have input into it, and not be required to raise any money.  
The present building will then belong totally to Rec and Parks.

Meeting adjourned at 8.13pm.
